

Salisbury University

In partnership with Salisbury University, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln offers courses that may be beneficial to students completing degrees through Salisbury University.

Through the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, College Independent Study program, students:

- Enroll at any time.
- Complete courses in as fast as five weeks or take up to a full year.
- Are not required to be admitted to University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

General Education Requirements

All students seeking a bachelor's degree from Salisbury University are required to complete a series of General Education courses (minimum 47 credit hours).

These University of Nebraska-Lincoln, College Independent Study courses apply to Salisbury University general education requirements.

Group I: 15 credit hours/five courses
